- I promise to take to my work an attitude of open-mindedness, to be willing to be trained for it, to bring to it interest and attention.
- I realize that I may have assets that my co-workers may not have. I will not let this make me feel inadequate and will still endeavor to assist in developing good teamwork
- I plan to find out how I can best service the activity for which I have volunteered, and to offer as much as I can give, but no more.
- I realize I must live up to my promise and, therefore, will be careful that my agreement is so simple and clear that it cannot be misunderstood.
- I believe that my attitude toward volunteer work should be professional. I believe that I have an obligation to my work, to those who direct it, to my colleagues, to those for whom it is done and to the public.

So far this year, we have volunteered for a total of 2,879 hours for Mayfair PTSA activities. I urge you not to run out of energy as we continue the journey to making a better future for every child. Again, we thank you for all that you do.

It is named the official national memorial to the Space Shuttle *Columbia* by a joint resolution of the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives. The Space Center honors the crew of STS-107 lost on February 1, 2003.




#### **Purposes of the PTA**
